Fighting to Keep a Legacy Alive

ack Snyder, a resident of The Woodlands at St. Barnabas, has made it his life's work to keep alive the legacy of the Marines who fought at the Battle of Iwo Jima.

Snyder grew up in Monessen, Westmoreland County...When World War II broke out in 1941, he said {Monessen} lost a significant portion of the male population to military enlistments. "Everybody was going," he said. "People were dropping out of high school to enlist."

He graduated from Monessen High School in 1942, but was only 17, so he had to wait a year to enlist. In 1943, he enlisted in the Marines...In September, 1944, Snyder joined the 4th Marine Division to train for combat...{in}1945, they were shipped out to an unknown location for an amphibious landing. That was Iwo Jima, a small volcanic island south of Japan...a strategic stronghold for Japanese forces.

Before the invasion of the island, Navy and Army Air Forces began naval bombardments and air raids for several months to "soften up the defenders." But unbeknownst to the advancing Marines, the island held 22,000 Japanese fighters in a system of underground bunkers and tunnels...The 4th and 5th Marine divisions sent the first wave of what would be about 30,000 Marines to land on the beach at 9 a.m. Feb. 19, 1945. As soon as they hit ground, the Japanese sprung from their hiding places and opened fire.

... "Once we had all those men on the beach, there was nowhere for them to hide...they decimated us..."

As part of a reserve regiment, Snyder landed on the beach at 4 p.m. to back-up the first assault wave. He was part of a machine gun squad. They fought until March 26, 1945 when they claimed control over the island. Snyder calls his time in Iwo Jima "scary," saying he said more prayers in 26 days then he had in a lifetime.

...One of the defining moments of the war for Snyder was on March 1, when he and six other men had taken a defensive position in a bombed out Japanese anti-aircraft {foxhole} overnight.

... "They {the Japanese} recognized that we were there and lobbed a concussion grenade that hit the wall and rolled in. Sgt.{George} Barlow sounded 'grenade'...when he covered the grenade, it exploded and ... tore into his midsection. And he was in real bad shape."

Snyder called for a medic and when none appeared, he ran out of the foxhole to get a corpsman...by the time Snyder got back to the foxhole, Barlow had died. When Snyder was evacuated from the island, he told officers on the ship of Barlow's heroism and tried to get him a bronze star. But he had lost track of the other members of the squad in the foxhole that night and could not get a second witness to corroborate his story.

Snyder returned home to Monessen and joined the Marine Reserves in 1947...He took up his old job as a short order cook at Johnson's Restaurant...where he met his wife, Eleanore...They dated for about three years before getting married on Sept. 9, 1950. Several weeks after the wedding, Snyder got a call to come back into action to help fight the Korean War.

"My wife didn't even know I was in the reserves," he said.

... As a veteran, Snyder spent a year in Camp Lejune, N.C. training a new outfit of Marines...to prepare them for the Korean War. He was discharged... on Dec. 8, 1951 as a staff sergeant.

He and Eleanore had four children and raised their family in Monessen...He retired from Beacon Supply Company in Belle Vernon in 1988 after 18 years there. Once he was retired, he took up the task that he had put by the wayside after



leaving Iwo Jima – he wanted to get Sgt. Barlow the {commendation} Snyder felt he deserved for saving his life in March, 1945. However, without the second

witness to verify the story, Snyder has hit more roadblocks...But he's continuing to pursue different avenues...

Today, Snyder maintains his collection of memorabilia from the war and talks of giving it away, but he needs to find the right person who will respect and share the history as he has done. He wants people to remember the Marines' battle in Iwo Jima.

"What I went through was probably historically one of the fiercest battles ever fought," Snyder said.



Christmas Accident Victim in Recovery at St. Barnabas

arly Dec. 26, 2013, 69-year-old
Jack Orseno was returning home
to Franklin, PA from a family
Christmas celebration at his nephew
Matthew's home in West Deer Township.
It was snowing. The roads were slick.
Jack slid around a bend on Route 8 and
crashed into a truck, sending him into
intensive therapy and to St. Barnabas for
treatment and rehabilitation.

Jack's brother Paul recalls: "He's lucky to be alive. His arms and legs were all smashed up."

Officially, his condition was described as "suffering hemorrhagic shock, multiple bone fractures, left hip dislocation, reduction of all extremities fractures."

Upon admission to St. Barnabas, Jack received physical, occupational and speech therapies. He required assistance with all daily living activities. He was on a feeding tube and a Hoyer Lift was used to transfer him.

Looking forward to a happy Christmas at St. Barnabas Nursing Home are 70-year-old patient Jack Orseno and Director of Nursing Maricris Regino. Currently Jack is on a regular diet and is able to transfer himself to a motorized wheelchair with contact guard and to travel in and out of St. Barnabas Nursing Home. He can dress himself with adaptive equipment and can ambulate a restorative 75 feet with a walker.

Jack's recovery has been remarkable. And Jack's spirit is inspiring. Jack gives all the credit to the St. Barnabas rehab team. He is especially pleased that he can travel through the woods on the nursing home grounds in his electric wheelchair. According to Jack, he used to take daily walks in the woods around his Franklin home, regardless of the weather.

"My goal is to walk out of here under my own steam and into those woods at home," he confides.

Jack was born and raised in Franklin. He never married. His cats were his family. After graduating from Franklin High School, he worked at a foundry in Franklin for 17 years and then was manager of Hilltop Beverage in Franklin. His hitch in the U.S. Army took him to Viet Nam for a year and three days, Jack's exact count.

This year, Jack will be spending Christmas with his new family and friends at St. Barnabas. But his brother Paul, of Allison Park, and his nephews: Matthew, Bradley and Douglas, will be visiting and bringing his great nephew and niece to see him.

Jack's sights are set on Christmas 2015 and returning home to walk in the woods.

"But I will miss all my friends at St. Barnabas," Jack adds. "They are the ones who are working so hard to help me take those walks."

Planned Giving Is Not Complicated

artha is a 79-year-old widow living in the Village at St. Barnabas. She enjoys playing bridge with fellow residents, never misses a movie in Hilltop Hall and still works the *New York Times* crossword puzzles. We are calling her Martha to ensure her confidentiality.

While Martha's stock portfolio has done fairly well since the credit crisis of 2008, the more conservative portion of her portfolio (bonds and CDs) is not generating nearly as much income as it used to due to the current low interest rates being paid. She's also getting a little concerned that the stock market might be in for a drop, but if she sells some of her stocks to try to avoid this risk, she has to pay income taxes on the capital gains and her Medicare premium might go up. Martha would also like to increase the monthly income she receives from her investments to help keep up with inflation.

After meeting with representatives from St. Barnabas, Martha learned that there was a way she could:

- Reduce her exposure to stocks without triggering capital gains taxes to be paid.
- Increase the amount of income she receives every month.

- Generate a charitable contribution deduction, further increasing disposable income.
- Make a gift to help current and future patients of St. Barnabas.

St. Barnabas discussed several planned giving options and advised Martha to discuss these options with her financial advisor and trusted friends and family before making any decision. St. Barnabas also met with Martha's advisors, at their request.

With the end of 2014 so close, Martha decided to create a Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA), donating appreciated investments directly to St. Barnabas Charities, thus avoiding any capital gains taxes. CGAs currently available to Martha are paying a minimum of 6.6% fixed rate of interest. Furthermore, creating a CGA has provided Martha with a charitable contribution

deduction to benefit her tax situation going forward, and a portion of her quarterly payments are tax free. And the icing on the cake is the knowledge that her investment will support the Free Care Fund for patients.

The benefits afforded to Martha, St. Barnabas and the patients by this CGA is a win, win, and win for all. Thank you, Martha!



What memories Rose Gravina must have had in her 104 years of life. From her Silent Movie Piano days to a life devoted to her husband of 74 years, Orlando "Art" Gravina and her four children. Our prayers are with him and his family.)
