



All are serviced by St. Barnabas Medical Center and the clinical facilities: St. Barnabas Nursing Home, living assistance and memory care at The Arbors at St. Barnabas, as well as St. Barnabas Home Care and our compassionate Hospice Team.

With the help of our supporters St. Barnabas Charities has expanded our fund raising to include the net proceeds of two golf courses, an auto repair shop, a boutique thrift store, and several highly successful annual fundraising events. Meanwhile St. Barnabas Radio Network promotes and unites our efforts in three counties.

Nearly 20 years ago, that winding road led him to St. Barnabas and The Arbors Valencia, where he launched his career as a personal care aide - and found his calling.

"I love it here. I'm here for the residents. It's an honor to do the job," Crowe said. "It's an honor to take care of these people."

Crowe works the 2-11 p.m. shift, preparing and distributing medications, checking blood sugars, assisting with meals, and addressing residents' medical needs. His varied life experiences have equipped him with patience, compassion, humor, and positivity - all qualities that make him a trusted caregiver.

"I try to find the positive in everything. You can always look for the negative," he said. "I like making them laugh. Sometimes I can be a clown."


That positivity often brings comfort to families. When a new resident with cancer moved in, his wife of 68 years was distraught at leaving him behind. Crowe reassured her with a hug and a promise: "We've got this. We'll make sure he's safe and we'll take care of him like you would want us to take care of him."

In another instance, he calmed a wife worried about her husband's sudden behavior change, explaining it might be caused by a treatable UTI. She returned later to find her husband back to his cheerful self.

Despite such personal impact, Crowe is quick to credit his colleagues. "We're a team here on the shift. We do a lot for each other. We can count on each other," he said.

That teamwork and his dedication make Crowe a model of the St. Barnabas 125-year-old mission - providing the best of care for all patients regardless of their ability to pay for that care.

"It's an honor, believe me. I never thought I'd be doing this."

For 96-year-old Alberta Farls, family is everything whether it's said in English or Italian. This world traveler has been to France, England, Germany, South Korea, Japan, China. But Italy was the favorite

destination for the entire family including her late husband Sam, and their children: Kathy, Sue and Chris and Chris' wife Teresa and their sons Sam and Christian.

Now a resident of The Arbors at St. Barnabas, Valencia, Alberta's family visits just about every day,

especially Kathy, who lives in Ross Township and Chris of the North Hills, but even Sue, who lives in Florida, sees her mother every three months - and all video chat daily.

Alberta's Italian family connection was strengthened in college,

when she spent a year's study in Italy. A native of Latrobe, PA, she graduated from Greater Latrobe High School in the same class with Fred Rogers, Pennsylvania's own Mister Rogers, and golf great Arnie Palmer.

She earned her teacher's degree from Mount Holyoke College, S. Hadley, MA, with Italy as her major and became a special education and substitute teacher.

"Mother was a pioneer in women's education," Sue proudly proclaims. "Kathy and I were taught to be strong, to take care of ourselves, to never be afraid to try new things and always to be there for the family."

Chris also stressed how important education was to his mother: "Her heart went out to the kids who were struggling in school. She was their gritty, opinionated champion."

"I was a jack of all trades when I was teaching," Alberta said with a laugh. "My husband Sam was a full-time teacher of social studies until he retired in 1992. Just two years later, he died. Fortunately, I had my family and my wonderful friends, the Flamingo Ladies of Latrobe, to support me."

In 2016, when Alberta was 87, she moved to The Village at St. Barnabas, near to both Kathy and Chris.

"There was so much to do at The Village, and the people were so friendly. That's what was so important. I signed up for everything - every class, all the trips, the parties and activities, and I volunteered for all the events."

Then, in 2020, she fell and fractured her leg and she did her rehabilitation at St. Barnabas' living assistance facility, The Arbors at Valencia, and it became her permanent home. Again, she participates in all the activities, loves jigsaw and word puzzles, reading, shopping and, above all, music and art.

Chris emphasizes his mother's love for art and music, which she has passed onto all of them.

"Her color sense is remarkable," Chris explains. "And when she hears music, she directs with her hands and, if it's in Italian, she sings along."

Her dedicated family takes her out on weekends to look for deer in North Park or to meet with her Pink Flamingo friends. On Sundays Teresa cooks dinner for Alberta.

Often, they go shopping in Ross Park Mall or to Jimmy's in Mars, PA for Belgian waffles.

"And I never miss Happy Hour here at The Arbors," Alberta adds with her wonderfully big, wide smile.

"Our family was extremely impressed with how St. Barnabas handled the COVID situation, doing everything possible to keep families informed and united, and, as a registered nurse, I know how difficult and vital that was,"

Kathy confided.

"For me," Alberta says, "family is everything. I am never lonely here at St. Barnabas because I really have two families - my children and all the St. Barnabas staff, like Anna, Shala and Bonnie."

Thankful for God's Blessings

This has been and is a major goal in Nancy Santory's role as a faithful St. Barnabas donor - to share God's blessings.

"My life has truly been a series of blessings and goals," Nancy explains. "When I graduated from high school, my goal had been to become a math teacher, and I had a full-tuition scholarship to Carnegie Mellon. Even though I was 6th in the freshman class after the first semester, college just wasn't working for me, so I dropped out."

"As my life went on, I worked for an insurance company in downtown Pittsburgh and married David Santory, who became a guidance counselor at Pine Richland High School. We had one child, Melissa, who was always our priority, and for the next 10 years, I worked part-time as a kitchen designer/salesperson to supplement our income. Then in 1985, I set a new goal - to go back to college and get my degree. I earned my B.S. at the head of my class at Pitt and entered the corporate business world, rising through the leadership ranks to CEO of CooksonPeirce Wealth Management in 2007 until retiring in 2015."

It was through CooksonPeirce that she became a St. Barnabas Charities donor, attending her first Founder's Day event in 2011 as a corporate sponsor.

"The next day I called St. Barnabas to suggest that more women's items be included in silent auctions for future events," Nancy said. "I was not only invited to join the Founder's Day Planning Committee, but to co-chair the Silent Auction. I have been on the Planning Committee ever since."

"I enjoy my involvement and helping to raise funds for the free care of patients in need," Nancy said. "But it became much more personal when my husband became a patient at the St. Barnabas Nursing Home in March of this year. He had been hospitalized with complications resulting from metastasized prostate cancer at Shadyside Hospital and was then transferred to the Nursing Home for his follow-up care. Our entire family was truly impressed with the extraordinary care he received: our son-in-law, Daniel Anderson, our daughter, Melissa, and their two children, Cole, 14, and Alexandra, 12."

"Dave was a Nursing Home patient for almost three weeks, receiving the warmest, most attentive, and competent care possible. Very sadly, his condition worsened, and he died in Passavant Hospital - McCandless on April 17, 2025," she added, "the day after I attended the

St. Barnabas annual Founder's Day Celebration."

"My life has been greatly blessed in so many ways, especially by our grandchildren. Alexandra and Cole play ice hockey on different Worcester, Massachusetts-based teams and are doing remarkably well, even though they had never skated as youngsters. I now enjoy their games, in person and on videos. I wish that Dave was with me, but my support of St. Barnabas is one way to honor his memory."

"The quality and loving care Dave received at the St. Barnabas Nursing Home is what I want all patients to enjoy," Nancy said. "That's why I will continue to support the St. Barnabas Free Care Fund in any way I can, not just through contributions, but by supporting all St. Barnabas Charities events: Founder's Day, the annual Golf Open, Free Care 5K, Sporting Clays, and Ladies Day Out. It is wonderful that the events are appealing to more and more young donors. Their participation and support are crucial to fulfilling the Free Care Mission for another 125 years!"
